

THE COMMUNION MOTET Ave verum corpus – Byrd HOLY COMMUNION

At this time, Holy Communion is to be received in the hand under the species of bread alone. Sanitary restrictions prevent us from using the communion rail. All are free to receive standing or kneeling on the pads provided. If you are wearing a mask, you must remove it before receiving the Sacred Host from the priest. You must consume the Eucharist immediately and in front of the priest before stepping away. Please inspect your hands to ensure that no fragment of the Sacred Host remains. If you find a fragment or small particle has adhered to your hand, please consume it immediately.
